Leicestershire Police talk about crimes against historical buildings

Leicestershire Police are aware of crime issues that affect historical buildings and places of worship. In order to help address this, the force has a team of established Heritage Watch volunteers who form part of a Rural Watch team, covering Leicestershire and Rutland.

The team is made up of several police volunteers, who do much more than you'd realise. The team visits churches, carries out risk assessments, offers advice on crime prevention and provides the basics to help prevent crime.


The team also attends local events to meet with representatives of the local diocese and other archaeological groups. The volunteers have developed a close working relationship with Heritage Watch and Historic England.

They are integral in helping local policing areas and providing assistance in relation to heritage related crime.

The volunteers are keen to hear from local churches, asking that a risk assessment is completed for each church, in order to identify if the church is vulnerable to criminality.

They are keen on finding out about any case studies, good practices or ideas which might assist churches/historic buildings from being attacked in the way that they are.

The team says, "Sadly, due to the value of metals currently, churches are deemed to be a target for criminals and the impact is more than monetary value, it also has an impact on the community."

“As a team, we visit churches to offer assistance and advice. However, we would ask that the churches themselves and the community also look at crimes linked to churches and also how the churches could help themselves, i.e. be aware of suspicious activity, use the church more often, have a group of volunteers who can check it regularly and talk about basic crime prevention, i.e. lighting, signs, anti-climb paint etc. We know this isn't the cure, but it's a step in the right direction, and we want to be part of that direction”

designs this newsletter every other month.

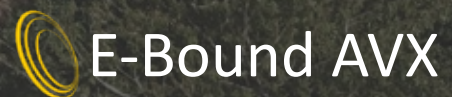
Sarah and Stacey are based in the finance office, working diligently behind the scenes to keep everything ticking over.

- A scheduled call out fee is £140 which includes 1 hour of travel, there is then a charge for each hour our engineers are on-site
- We do not currently offer a 24 hour overnight service
- Arrival is on a best endeavours, first-come first-served basis taking into account our workloads and priorities at the time
- For any visit for a roof alarm, our engineers will need access to the tower, mute button and fobs. Please ensure the bells are down
- After each visit, a call-out record is completed, a copy of which will be left with the customer
